- Batman appeared in *Detective Comics* # 27 (1939)
 - published by National Periodicals
 - creators Bob Kane / Bill Finger
 - inspired by:
 - the Shadow
 - Doc Savage adventurer, polymath
 - the Mask of Zorro







millionaire playboy



First to wear skin-tight suit



- Batman's features
- like Superman
 - wore costume
 - fought crime
 - had secret identity
 - billionaire playboy Bruce Wayne
 - emerged from family trauma
- but unlike Superman
 - had no super powers
 - often worked outside of the law vigilante
 - "If you can't beat them 'inside' the law, you must beat them 'outside' it ... and that's where I come in!" (Batman # 43, September 1940)



Detective Comics # 33 (November 1939)

- Early Batman issues
 Wright, Comic Book Nation, p. 17
 - unusual style
 - appeal to a kind of cinematic sensibility
 film noir
 - introduced panoply of characters that straddled between comedy and absurdity
 - Robin
 - what was the rationale?
 - The Joker deranged homicidal maniac
 - The Riddler
 - Cat Woman
 - The Penguin
 - Two-Face



 - Bill Finger (1914-1974)
 - Bob Kane (1915-1998)
 - both second-generation Jewish immigrants
- Batman & Bill (2007) documentary
